


## **MEGST Cup**

Even when I received opposition from others, I accepted the situation, knowing God was training me to become a more mature leader. As I prepared myself, God opened many more opportunities for me.

In my leadership position, I am treated like a mother to the next generation – even though I am not old enough. I am not saying that I am perfect; I still face challenges, but I have confidence that God is leading me, and I will keep moving forward and break through any hindrance that comes.
