reetings to all of you from Myanmar especially from Myanmar Evangelical Graduate School of Theology (MEGST). First, we give all glory and honor to God. Because of His faithfulness, wonderful providence, and his guidance, the Graduation ceremony of 2023-



2024 academic year held on 17 February went well amid the political crises. The presence of Brother Russell Thorp (Executive Director Beacon Partnership, New Zealand) and Dr. Cindy Perry (DAI Sr Consultant, and Regional Director Southeast

Asia) in our graduation celebration was a great blessing for the MEGST Community. We also thank God that we had 37 graduates, 25 from Master of Divinity (MDiv), 6 from Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership (MAOL) and 6 from Doctor of Ministry (DMin). It was an historic event to have the first DMin graduates in the history of MEGST.

Moreover, in addition to the coup, the military government's recent decision of the conscription for young males sounds ominous and affects many young people including our theological students in this period of Myanmar's insecurity. As most of our students are from the countryside, they stayed in the

dormitory, which the school provided. They must apply to the local authority office for their domestic 'visa' every month. Another challenge we have been facing is that travel is risky for all of us, especially for all students for their coming to MEGST and going home. Due to the political unrest, many houses were burned and destroyed, and many have become homeless, running from their homes. consequences of these unwanted circumstances are that some students have difficulty in settling their school fees because their parents and relatives could not work on their farms and businesses, and even our outdoor activities of the school for physical fitness could not be done as planned. We are indeed living and working in a very difficult and stressful context. However, we are totally committed to our theological journey to equip and train our students to be Christ-like leaders. Therefore, we humbly covet your fervent prayers and support so that we will be able to continue to run our School, and that our students will be excused from this compulsory military service. Last but not least, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks to all our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world who have been firmly standing with us, faithfully encouraging us, fervently praying for us, and supporting us generously. May God continuously bless you all bountifully.

Dr. Paul Barker's Visit






MEGST Alumni Meeting
